- Opportunities for new National Biodiversity and Strategic Action Plans to address connectivity and more effectively meet commitments of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework; and
- Insights and examples to inspire the integration of connectivity conservation science, policy, and best practice across terrestrial, freshwater, and marine ecosystems.
